Grape Varieties: Touriga Nacional (60%), Syrah (38%) and Viogner (2%).
Harvested by hand, fermented in "tronco-conic" stainless steel vats at 24°C, producing 10,000 bottles.

Duas Pedras is from a partnership between English wine writer Richard Mayson and Portuguese wine maker Rui Reguinga. The wine is a blend of three grape varieties Touriga Nacional, Syrah and a small quantity of Viognier grown at the Quinta do Centro near Portalegreon the westerly slopes of the Serra de Sao Mamede, the highest mountain range in Southern Portugal.

Named after the granite and schist found in the locality, Duas Pedras is bottled without aging in oak to capture the vibrant mountain fruit character.

Tasting Notes: Rich and soft with blackberry, plum and black currant flavors.

Food Pairing: Roasted and grilled meats.
