## TECHNICAL NOTES

CHATEAU DE  
**LANCYRE**

en Pic Saint Loup

### CHÂTEAU/DOMAINE DE LANCYRE 2013 VIEILLES VIGNES

*Purchased in 1970 by the Durand and Valentin families, the Château was originally built in the 1500's, on the ruins of a 12th century fort. Records of winemaking date back to 1550! Lancyre is now viewed among the top estates of Pic Saint-Loup, which has justifiably garnered a reputation as the Languedoc's single best wine district.*

#### VINEYARDS

About 192 acres total (135 acres of AOC vineyards) planted to Syrah, Grenache, Mourvèdre, Cinsault, Roussanne, Marsanne, Rolle & Viognier.

#### APPELLATION

AOP Pic Saint Loup.

#### COMPOSITION

65% Syrah, 35% Grenache.

#### VITICULTURE

Yields of 2.67 tons/acre. Clay/limestone based soils.

Pic Saint-Loup is widely viewed as the Languedoc's best wine district. Vineyards are 15 miles inland from the Mediterranean, at almost 2,000 feet above sea level. Summer days are blazingly hot (103°F!), but night-time temperatures almost always drop to below 60°F - sometimes even below 50°F!

Syrah (the principal grape of Pic Saint-Loup) is usually picked in early October, and not in late August, as it is in many Languedoc and Southern Rhône vineyards. Stylistically, the wines are closer to Northern Rhône wines than their Southern Rhône counterparts (think Hermitage and Côte-Rôtie, not Châteauneuf-du-Pape).

#### VINIFICATION

21 days cuvaison at temperatures of 82°- 86°F. Unoaked – vinified entirely in stainless steel tanks.

#### ALCOHOL

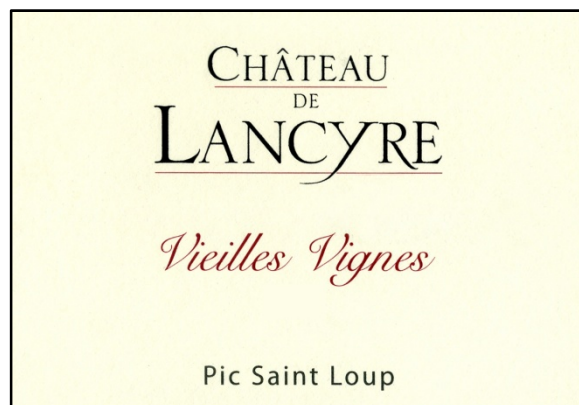

#### TASTING NOTES

Lancyre's flagship bottling, produced from some of the oldest Syrah vines in the Languedoc! Cassis, plums, spearmint and licorice on the nose. Deep and dense on the palate, with an underlying minerality and a long finish.

#### SERVE WITH

Excellent with filet of beef, grilled tuna steak, or gamebirds.
